We are delighted to share that 142 children have achieved 100% attendance in the first half term!

Punctuality

So far this academic year, there have been 746 late marks recorded in our registers. This means that, on average, over 16 children are arriving late every day.

Even being a little late adds up. For example, a child who is 5 minutes late every day has already missed 3 ¼ hours of learning time this year — the equivalent of nearly a full morning in school.

To help ensure a calm and positive start to the day, please make sure all children arrive between 8:40am and 8:50am and enter through the side gate. Arriving within this time window will help children avoid receiving a late mark and ensure they are settled and ready for learning.
